Tobacco Treatment Center—Classes are provided in an ongoing group format on Mondays from 8:30am – 9:30am; Monday evenings from 5:30pm – 6:30pm; Thursdays from 1:00pm–2:00pm; a specialized group for dual diagnosis patients meets on Fridays at 10:00am. Nicotine replacement therapy and other medications to aid in quitting tobacco use are provided. Tobacco Treatment is also provided in the CBOC's. Referrals- Coordinator, Susan Myre, RN, MS, LCDC III, CTTS, Ext. 5515

Opioid Substitution Program (OSP) – Provides opiate agonist therapy (methadone maintenance) and drug treatment for patients with long-term opiate addiction problems. Counseling, case management, and group therapy are important components of the program. All patients need to be assessed prior to initiating care. Referrals - Coordinator, Kimberly Caldwell, MA, LCDC III, Ext. 4857

Buprenorphine Treatment Clinic (BTC) - Suboxone (Buprenorphine) treatment is also provided for opiate dependent patients. All patients need to be assessed prior to initiating care. Counseling, case management and group therapy are also important components of this program. Referrals – Coordinator, Kevin Sexton LISW–S, Ext. 5169
